In re: CAFO Road Damage Issue

Dear Mr. Moyer:

I feel it is important to bring the road damage issue to your attention once again. My husband and I regularly walk and bike the country roads surrounding our home. On June 7th when riding our bikes on County Road 14, we discovered some obvious recent road damage which appears to have come from field tiling equipment. You can see from the photos enclosed that at the time of the road damage, there were several pieces of heavy equipment sitting in the field off of County Road 14 and Findlay Road. If our roads can be damaged by just one field being tilled, what will the heavy equipment from constructing the CAFOs, milk hauling trucks, manure hauling trucks, etc. do to our roads? We continue to feel that it is in the best interests of the citizens of Sandusky County to request a consultation with each of the proposed dairies to ensure that the citizens of Sandusky County are not financially burdened by the CAFO operations. I would note that the Mayor and council members of the Village of Woodville have requested such consultation, but have not yet had the courtesy of a response.

Per your previous correspondence, pursuant to §5577.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, please investigate this road damage to assess the damage and the responsible party to pay for the repairs. To the best of my knowledge, Black Swamp Holdings LLC is the land owner of the field that was tilled. This Code section appears to require the assistance of the Woodville Township Trustees or County Commissioners in investigating and assessing the appropriate party to pay for the road repairs. Because of the possibility that this damage relates to the field recently tilled by Black Swamp Holdings LLC, Trustee Liskai and Commissioner Liskai may be conflicted in appropriately assessing this matter.

I would note that in observing the road this evening, it appears to be getting worse than it was when we initially discovered the damage, which we assume is because of

the normal road traffic on the damaged area. The collapse at the roads edge is clearly increasing in size. Please let me know what action will be taken to remedy this situation.
